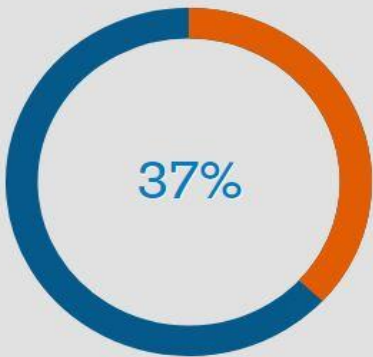

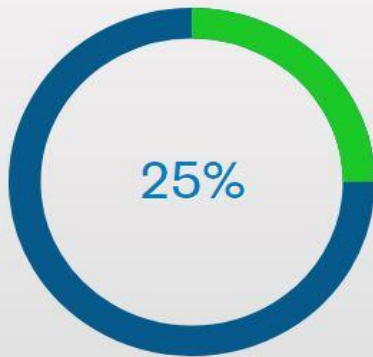

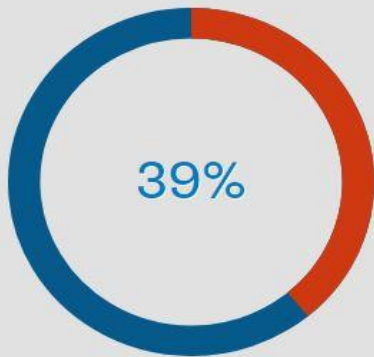
PERCENTAGE OF STUDENT-ATHLETES IN DIVISION

# NJCAA/CC



Junior colleges are two-year universities that give student-athletes an opportunity to develop their athletic and academic skills in a post high school program. With more than 500 junior college softball programs, the opportunities are almost endless. And if you think these teams aren't tough—think again! Many junior college softball teams have future D1 and D2 athletes on their roster who are there to hone their skills before they commit to a four-year school. For athletes who may not have the grades, finances or build yet for a four-year school, a junior college softball program can be a great way to gain experience competing against collegiate athletes while developing those essential skills.

## Are there junior college softball scholarships?

Yes, junior colleges can—and do—offer scholarships for qualified athletes! Depending on the school and how funded the program is, qualified athletes might receive a partial or full-ride scholarship to attend the school.

## Are there junior college softball championships?

Before you can be certified to compete at a Division I or II school, we need to know more about your academic history and sports experiences. We'll also need your standardized test scores, high school transcripts and your request for final amateurism certification.

## Request Your Amateurism Certification


Available during your senior year of high school.

- 1. Create an account & pay the registration fee for D1 & D2 schools (\$90).
  - If you aspire to play in a D3 program, only sign up for D3 because there is no registration fee.
  - It's important to know that there are fee waivers available for students on free/reduced lunch with approval from your high school guidance counselor.
- 2. Send The NCAA your ACT/SAT Score each time you take the exams by writing the code 9999 on your exam.
- 3. Request your amateurism certification during your senior year of high school from your high school guidance counselor.

- Could be 1 way or a combination
  - Club Tournaments & Coach Recommendations
  - College Camps and/or Showcases
  - High School Sections and/or State Tournament
- Rarely recruit on video alone

# College Recruiting Plan by Season



## Fall

- Introduction Email with Fall Schedule
- Before each Tourney, send specific tournament schedule
  - Field, time, opponent
- After each Fall Tourney, send an update
  - Videos, stats, results if good
- At end of Fall, send summary email with compiled good video & stats
- Keep an eye out for Camps/Showcases

## Winter

- Introduction Email with Dome Schedule
- After each Dome week, send an update
  - Videos, stats, results if good
- At end of Winter, send summary email with compiled good video & stats
- Keep an eye out for Camps/Showcases

## Spring

- Introduction Email with Sections/State Schedule
- At end of High School season, send summary email with compiled good video & stats

## Summer

- Introduction Email with Summer Schedule
- Before each Tourney, send specific tournament schedule
  - Field, time, opponent
- After each Summer Tourney, send an update
  - Videos, stats, results if good
- At end of Summer, send summary email with compiled good video & stats
- Keep an eye out for Camps/Showcases

# COLLEGE CAMPS



- A's > Recruitment > College Camps to Attend
- Fall, Winter & Summer
- When attending Camps:
  - Wear Vortex/A's Uniform
  - Hustle everywhere
  - Ask questions
  - Answer the coaches' and players' questions
  - What can you do to get noticed?
    - Dive, Hit the ball hard, show off your speed, arm, glove, effort, IQ, love of the game, etc.
    - Show off your strengths
  - Get to know other campers & cheer them on
  - Eye Contact
  - At the end of the camp, introduce yourself to coaches, thank them for the camp, ask for feedback, ask questions, etc.
  - Email before and after



# EMAILING COLLEGE COACHES



- Subject Line: Your Name, Grad Year, Positions, Team
- Greet Coach(es) by name
- Introduce yourself
  - HS, Grad Year, Club Program, Club Team, Coaches, Positions
- Explain what you like about the school and program – Research this!
- Talk about yourself
  - Highlight reel/videos, GOOD stats, academic accomplishments
- Additional Items
  - Camps
  - Your Schedule
- Closing
  - Thank You, Name, Grad Year, Position, Team(s)
  - Coaches Names & Contact Info



# COACH RESPONSES



- No response
  - Doesn't mean they didn't read it
  - Doesn't mean you're not on their list
  - They can't respond with anything personal until Junior Year
- Responses
  - Vague with camp information
  - Vague thank you
  - Personal message to you
- Stay at the top of their inbox
- Update as much as you can
- Be persistent
- Put the work in
- Athlete emails a college coach 5+ times over a 2+ year span. No response until Junior Year saying they're interested.
- "We are going to know your name if you've been emailing since 9<sup>th</sup> grade."





# QUESTIONS TO ASK COACHES



- What does a typical day look like in each season (Fall, Winter, Spring)?
  - What are the difference between in-season and out of season training?
  - What are some of your coaching philosophies?
  - What does your current team structure look like?
  - What does your current roster and recruits look like in my position(s)?
  - How many roster spots do you like have?
  - How many spots are you looking to add in my graduation class?
  - What are the next steps in the recruitment process for us?
  - What is the team like?
  - What are the coaches' different strengths?
  - What's the campus life like?
  - What are typical class sizes?
  - What are some of the players' majors?
  - Do players have jobs while playing?
-

# QUESTIONS TO ASK COACHES



- How many years have you coached at this school? What are your future plans or goals?
  - How many players do you have on your team? How many seniors do you have?
  - Do you keep walk-ons?
  - How many players are on scholarship? Partial or full?
  - What is your team GPA? What percentage of your athletes graduate in 4 or 5 years?
  - What are your academic requirements? What type of academic supervision and assistance do you have?
  - What type of study tables do you have and who has to go?
  - Does your school have academic priority scheduling? What is the school policy on missed classes for athletes?
  - How many players can you travel with?
  - Who are the players currently on the team that play the position(s) you play?
  - What year and how many years have they started?
  - What are your recruiting needs and priorities? What positions are you recruiting?
  - If you are a sophomore or junior, what summer tournaments do you go to? What information would they like for you to provide for them? Is there anything that they want or need you to do?
  - Do you want a video?

# QUESTIONS TO ASK COACHES



- Is it possible to play another sport?
  - What are your team rules or policies?
  - What was your team record the last couple of years? Ask about conference play?
  - Where do you go to play your games? Do you take a spring trip?
  - What are the time commitments through the various times of the year?
  - Do you have a fall season?
  - What times are your practices, conditioning, weight training, and individual workouts?
  - Where do you practice and play your games? What are the facilities that you use?
  - Do you have an athletic trainer at your practices, home games, and away games? Who treats injuries?
  - Where do the athletes live and who do they live with? Do they have to live on campus?
  - Can freshmen have cars? How do players get to practice?
  - When you travel, how do you travel? Bus, vans, fly?
  - What equipment is provided by the school and what equipment do you have to provide for yourself?
  - Are there any additional costs that you will have playing at your school?
  - What fundraising projects do you have your team do?
  - What community service projects does your team do?
  - How successful is the school's athletic program? Are the women treated equally as the men's programs?
  - If you receive a scholarship offer you want to ask these questions:
    - What will the scholarship cover?
    - How or why would a scholarship be reduced or taken away?
  - If you are injured what happens to your scholarship?
  - Do you have summer school scholarship aid?
  - Do you have scholarship aid for 5th year seniors?
  - Will the increase in tuition, room, and board be covered by your scholarship?

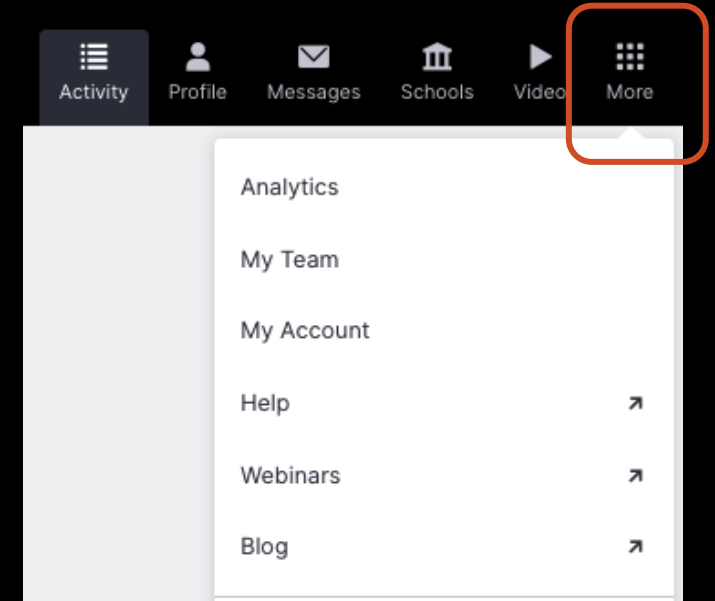
